

Downtown Bend was the place to be on Friday, May 5 – and it had nothing to do with Cinco de Mayo celebrations or the city's First Friday Art Walk. Ben Hong, Associate Principal Cellist for the L.A. Philharmonic, performed for a full house at the Tower Theatre in the season finale concert of the High Desert Chamber Music Concert Series. With works by Beethoven, Shostakovich, and Rachmaninoff, the evening's performance thrilled the audience to an arousing standing ovation

The next morning. May 6, six young cellists ranging in age from 13-21 were treated to some knowledge, guidance, and insight from Mr. Hong. Kaleo Kronberg from Bend began the program with the Bourée movements from Bach Cello Suite No.3, followed by Andy Shin from Portland performing Popper's *Tarantella*. Next up was Pearl Liao from Vancouver and playing the first movement of the Boccherini Cello Concerto. Then Annie Rhew from Portland performed the Prelude from Bach Cello Suite No.3. Jacob Park from Lake Oswego performed select movements of the Tchaikovsky *Rococo Variations*, and Sophie Phillips-Meadow from Eugene concluded the program with the final movement of the Elgar Cello Concerto. In addition to demonstrating techniques and ideas on his beautiful 1737 Calcanius of Genoa cello, Ben gave the students his undivided attention, adjusting his statements, questions, and instruction based on each individual performer. There is no doubt this event had a lasting effect on these young musicians, as well as the audience members in attendance.
