

She is currently completing her doctorate at Teachers College, Columbia University, where her research focuses on studio teachers' holistic strategies for cultivating expressive performance in young violinists.

The Final Round of the 2021 Solo Competition was held live on December 12th at Portland State University. It was a full day of wonderful performances by the 18 Finalists who had been selected from 40 applicants in the Preliminary Round.

The competition process is very educational at every step, and we hope all who sent a Preliminary video gained valuable experience and knowledge. The next OR-ASTA Solo Competition will be held Sunday, November 6, 2022, for violin, viola, cello, double bass, classical guitar, and harp. The Preliminary Round will be done with submitted videos, due Saturday, October 8, 2022. Details will be emerging on our website at orasta.org.

This competition is normally a biennial event but is being held for a second year in a row because of a Covid detour. After this November competition, the next one will be in 2024. There will be two divisions:

Senior Division ages 16-22 on or before 11/6/22.

Junior Division ages 15 and under, on or before 11/6/22. Last year we awarded 3 prizes in each division, giving out \$1600 in prize money.
